Hall. We served meals before the service for the people who lived in downtown Fairbanks, some were homeless. Ever since the beginning of Covid in 2020, we have not had access to this facility. We are believing that we will have access to those facilities again, since it is for the Native Peoples' of Interior Alaska, or that God would provide something better in the downtown area where there are so many people that need ministry.
