Druck. Please be in prayer for Marvin since he is facing some health issues and we know the Lord has many years of ministry for him yet!



My granddaughter, Karis Thurlby, is currently finishing her School of Evangelism with YWAM, in Tyler, Texas. Her outreach will begin with one week on the Texas border in Mercedes, working with immigrants. On April 8th, her team will fly to Tanzania for 6 weeks, ministering at the base in Arusha. This base recently experienced tragedy when eleven YWAM missionaries died in a bus accident returning from a ministry leadership conference. Both the base director and training leader passed away. Their team will encourage them during this time and will also do outreach to local tribes and orphanages. Be in prayer for her and the entire team. Most of the villages they will go to will not have power or modern plumbing.

As we have mentioned before, many villages in Alaska do not have pastors to disciple the communities. We hope to send out new, young leaders from the churches we work with here. Many pastors are older and we must pray and believe God that this generation will heed the call. This is the same need that KJNP has for new workers at the Christian radio station. There is no retirement for the Christian. We may retire from our earthly labors, but let us use our spiritual wisdom to pour into those around us. Let every moment count for His kingdom!
